Dr. Audrey Ruple is an Associate Professor in the Department of Population Health Sciences in the Virginia–Maryland College of Veterinary Medicine at Virginia Tech. Her research focus is in the area of “One Health,” the intersection of human, animal and environmental health. She has a particular interest in comparative biomedical aspects of cancer and aging and she uses companion dogs as a model system to better understand how we can all — humans and animals — age better.

Dr. Ruple is a licensed, clinical veterinarian and is a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine. She obtained her DVM, MS and PhD degrees from Colorado State University and is a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons in the United Kingdom.

Dr. Kwane Stewart (also known as “The Street Vet”) has been a practicing veterinarian in California for around 25 years and has worked in nearly every part of the profession.

After graduating from Colorado State University's Veterinary program, Dr. Kwane started his career as an associate and emergency clinician in San Diego. From there, he became the county veterinarian of a municipal shelter where he was able to help reverse one of the worst euthanasia rates in the country.

Dr. Kwane then became the chief medical officer at VETCO Hospitals, Inc. before spending 6 years as the chief veterinary officer at American Humane and the director of their legacy program, No Animals Were Harmed®. The program protects over 100,000 animals every year around the globe on film and TV sets.

Along the way, his veterinary expertise has been sought after by major companies, including Disney, United Airlines and SeaWorld, on how to improve their animal-care standards.

Dr. Kwane is a veterinarian at his practice, Papaya. Most recently, he joined Fetch by The Dodo's Veterinary Advisory Board, where he shares his expert advice on all aspects of pet health.

Dr. Evan Antin is a small animal, exotics and wildlife veterinarian. He works with wildlife around the world and of course our dogs and cats, as well as exotic animals, at Conejo Valley Veterinary Hospital in Thousand Oaks, California.

Evan originally hails from Overland Park, Kansas and studied evolutionary and ecological biology at the University of Colorado at Boulder. He spent semesters abroad in Australia and Tanzania to learn more about their respective ecology and wildlife. He then earned his Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine from Colorado State University with a small animal medicine and exotic animal medicine focus in 2013.

In addition to his love for pet dogs and cats, Evan is passionate about working with wildlife around the world. He treats individual animals with veterinary care and promotes broad scale conservation of species and habitats alongside conservationists and wildlife veterinary colleagues. For over fifteen years Evan has worked with wildlife in dozens of countries ranging from Southeast Asia, Australia and Pacific Islands, Africa, Central and South America and of course, North America.
